

Island Style Update

Our entire world is affected by COVID-19. We have deep gratitude for all of those that are working hard to comfort and cure and we have sympathy in our hearts for those that are directly suffering from the virus or have experienced the loss of a family member or friend. We suspect much of the information that we have to share is similar to what you are experiencing. It is important to us to stay connected with you and to keep everyone informed, so that together we can make akamai (clever) decisions, so that our islands can be safe and healthy, especially for our Kūpuna (elderly).

Hawai'i Governor David Ige has signed a supplemental emergency proclamation ordering the residents of Hawai'i to stay-at-home and to work-at-home. This order went into effect on March 25, 2020 and currently scheduled to run through April 30, 2020. Essential business' and their workers are exempt. And residents may only leave their homes for activities deemed essential such as buying necessities, grocery shopping, car repair, and/or to seek medical attention.

Schools & Parks

Public Schools will remain closed until April 30, 2020.

Parks and recreation locations across the state are closed, reopening date to be determined.

Stores

Essential stores such as grocery, pharmacies, and home hardware remain open with adjusted hours and special hours for Kūpuna only.

Restaurants

Restaurants and bars have been mandated to suspend dine-in services and can only offer take-away and delivery. Some are offering a "buy a Kūpuna a meal" option. You can purchase individual meals and they will deliver to those in need.

Hotels

The majority of our hotels have or will be closed by March 29, 2020. Those that remain operational are servicing existing reservations, and not taking new reservations.

Activities & Trans

The majority of our activity and transportation partners have suspended services in ordinance with the governor's mandate and continue to operate reservation systems from home offices.

Airlines

Airlines have reduced service significantly to and from Hawai'i and operate for essential travel and cargo.

Island Style Innovations remains operational, with staff working safely from home.

We have implemented an alternating three day work week with staff available every day.
