<b>Updated Date</b>	May 18, 2020
<b>Borders</b> (open, closed)	Closed
<b>Quarantine Details</b> (requirements for outside arrivals, locals on lock-down or stay at home)	Completely lockdown in Buenos Aires metropolitan area and main cities. Reduced lock down in a few cities with low density populations. Except Buenos Aires metropolitan area, all the cities with less than 500.00 citizens within Argentina is in Phase 4 of quarantine, than means with 75% of activities partially activated, except schools or universities.
<b>Cases</b> (increasing, decreasing, flat)	In recent days the curve has grown very slowly and slightly, although the government still considers it controlled and within the expected normality. Total cases: 8,068 Total deaths: 374 Total recovered: 2,625
<b>Groups</b> (limits on group gatherings, distancing requirements)	Not currently possible to have group activities or social opportunities. Still keeping the social distancing.
<b>Air</b> (carriers flying to/from country)	Borders closed. The only air traffic is for sanitary flights. The situation is being evaluated every week, to decide the date of possible re open for flights.
<b>Hotels</b> (open, closed, partially open)	Closed. Depending on the property, they are estimating to reopen in July or August, however is subject to the situation.


<b>Restaurants</b> (open, closed, capacity limits)	Closed. Most of them are working with food delivery to keep the business in activity. Gastronomy industry is putting hard efforts and is well organized together to maintain on going the business and jobs.
<b>Venues</b> (open, closed, capacity limits)	Closed.
<b>Tourist Sites</b> (open, closed, capacity limits)	Closed. All public parks, areas, museums and interest places are completely closed to access.
<b>Retail Stores</b> (open, closed, capacity limits)	Only supermarkets are opened with limit of capacity to access. Shipments are working perfectly inside the country, with some delays. The government has allowed small food stores to be opened with special permissions and certifications.
<b>Transportation</b> (public and private options)	<p><b>Public transport</b> is working, with a significantly reduced capacity. Distancing between seats, and facial masks is mandatory to enter. Special daily cleaning including sanitary measures, provided by the government to the vehicles and streets.</p> <p><b>Private transportation for groups:</b> Our transportation supplier has informed the new protocol for all the services from now on.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>-hand sanitizer gel in every vehicle.</li> <li>-special cleaning with alcohol spray 70% after every service</li> <li>-the cleaning was improved with approved specific products to eliminated germs, included covid 19. The name of the chemic product is Quaternary ammonium.</li> <li>-the driver is completely isolated from the passengers, in a separate cabin, without contact.</li> <li>-Based on the government requirements, all the transportation in the country cannot be more than 60% loaded. Every passenger must wear a facial mask.</li> </ul> <p>The updated capacity for buses is:  Buses of 45 seats can be loaded up to 27 seats.  Minibuses of 24 seats can be loaded up to 14 seats  Van of 19 seats can be loaded up to 11 seats.</p>
<b>Upcoming Key Dates</b>	End of May, new measures announcement based on the flow and numbers of cases.
<b>Destination Safety and Sanitary Initiatives</b> (in progress, certification program, etc.)	<p>Argentina was the first country in South America to take exterme measures, close the borders and announce lockdown for the whole country as soon as we got less than 10 confirmed cases. That allowed us to have a better control of the situation and prepare the hospitals and all the activities related with health to work in advance and be ready in case of a big increase of cases in a massive way, which, luckily has not happened. The advantage of an earlier lockdown, gave the government the opportunity to build temporary hospitals and also, take the measures of requesting mandatory lockdown and isolation to all the citizens that returned from abroad countries, prevented to increase the cases.</p> <p>Nowadays is absolutely mandatory the use of facial masks everywhere. Since 2 days ago, parents are allowed to get out of home 1 hour per day with their kids, up to 500 meters. Rest of the population must keep staying at home.</p>

The one exception to this is New Zealand, with the government meeting to reopen the trans-Tasman flights I.e. Australia to New Zealand and vice versa expanding the travel bubble to include both countries.</p>
<p><b>Quarantine Details</b> (requirements for outside arrivals, locals on lock-down or stay at home)</p>	<p>As at 18<sup>th</sup> May 2020, Australia with a population of over 25 million inhabitants has 7,056 with 6,367 recovered and 99 deaths, mainly in senior citizens homes. Employees are encouraged to WFH where it is reasonably practical to do so. Offices must adhere to the four-square-metre rule.</p>
<p><b>Cases</b> (increasing, decreasing, flat)</p>	<p>Definitely decreasing – Australia is very proud of decreasing COVID-19 and we continue to do all possible to maintain and decrease this.</p>
<p><b>Groups</b> (limits on group gatherings, distancing requirements)</p>	<p>From June 1<sup>st</sup>, 2020 Sydney Beauty Salons to reopen for a maximum of client clients and subject to four-square-metre rule. Up to 50 people allowed in restaurants, pubs, cafes, subject to four-square-metre rule with patrons being seated. Museums, galleries and libraries will re-open subject to the rules. Outdoor gatherings of up to 10 people Up to 5 visitors in a household at any time</p>

<b>Updated Date</b>	<p>May 18, 2020</p> <p>Please note: The following pieces of information have been researched with the utmost care. However, we can provide no guarantee of accuracy.</p>
<b>Borders</b> (open, closed)	<p>The Austrian Government has announced a complete opening of the border between Germany and Austria for June 15th.</p> <p>Talks with other neighboring countries are currently being held.</p>
<b>Quarantine Details</b>	People travelling to Austria are obligated to produce a medical certificate proving a negative COVID-19 test result upon entry. The certificate cannot be


(requirements for outside arrivals, locals on lock-down or stay at home)	older than 4 days when entering Austria. Without the certificate, entry will be denied. Transiting the Austrian territory without stopover is permitted. Entry by air is prohibited to third country nationals from states outside the Schengen area. Third country nationals travelling from inside the Schengen area by air, have to carry a medical certificate proving a negative COVID-19 test result and are obligated to commit to a 14-day quarantine.
<b>Cases</b> (increasing, decreasing, flat)	Decreasing
<b>Groups</b> (limits on group gatherings, distancing requirements)	For the time being, all events are prohibited until the end of June 2020. In public spaces, no more than ten people should gather in one place at the same time.
<b>Air</b> (carriers flying to/from country)	Vienna Airport, Innsbruck Airport and Salzburg Airport are operational, though with limited services. Austrian Airlines has suspended regular air traffic until May 31st.
<b>Hotels</b> (open, closed, partially open)	From May 29th, accommodation facilities are permitted to re-open their establishment for touristic purposes.
<b>Restaurants</b> (open, closed, capacity limits)	Since May 15th, gastronomic establishments are permitted to open until 11 pm. No more than 4 adults and their respective children may sit around one table. A minimum distance of 1 meter/3.3 feet has to be kept to people on neighboring tables. Service at the counter is not permitted. The wearing of face-masks is compulsory for the service staff, guests only on the way to the table.
<b>Venues</b> (open, closed, capacity limits)	Museums are open from May 15 <sup>th</sup> , however many institutions have decided to wait and open later. For indoor areas, the wearing of a mouth/nose protection as well as the providing of 10m <sup>2</sup> of space minimum per visitor are compulsory.
<b>Tourist Sites</b> (open, closed, capacity limits)	Sights, museums, theatres, opera houses and many more are currently closed. From the middle of May, many museums and sights will reopen under certain conditions (e.g. mouth and nose protection).
<b>Retail Stores</b> (open, closed, capacity limits)	Since the beginning of May, all shops that supply goods are open again, regardless of their size. The same goes for service providers such as hairdressers. The wearing of mouth/nose protection is compulsory in all shops.
<b>Transportation</b> (public and private options)	Currently, there are no restrictions in place regarding public transport (metro, bus and tram services) in Austria. The wearing of mouth/nose protection is compulsory in all public transport options.

<b>Quarantine Details</b> (requirements for outside arrivals, locals on lock-down or stay at home)	Brazil is divided in 26 States and the Federal District of Brasília, the Capital City of Brazil. Each State is responsible for the sanitary policies within its borders. Mayors of cities are also responsible for the definition of quarantine measure. In general, most large cities are under quarantine. Only pharmacies,

	drugstores, supermarkets, and restaurants for delivery only are open., besides hospitals and emergency rooms. Rio is adopting a stay at home policy.
<b>Cases</b> (increasing, decreasing, flat)	As of today, the number of cases in Brazil, which is a country of 211,000,000 plus inhabitants, is 363,211, with 22,666 deaths.
<b>Groups</b> (limits on group gatherings, distancing requirements)	No grouping allowed at this time. Beaches are closed in Rio de Janeiro, but public parks are open.
<b>Air</b> (carriers flying to/from country)	There are flights in and out of the country, but with restrictions on purpose of travel. Many international carriers have suspended flights, mostly until the beginning of July.
<b>Hotels</b> (open, closed, partially open)	Most hotels are closed until June 30 <sup>th</sup> .
<b>Restaurants</b> (open, closed, capacity limits)	Open only for delivery.
<b>Venues</b> (open, closed, capacity limits)	closed

Several cities have or are in the process of building field hospitals in stadiums, convention centers and other large open areas. Government is buying and distributing IPEs (individual protection equipment) to health professionals. <b>Borders</b> (open, closed)	All travelers entering Cambodia must possess a COVID-19 medical certificate, indicating a negative status, issued no more than 72 hours prior to the date of travel and proof of medical insurance coverage of at least \$50,000.




<b>Quarantine Details</b> (requirements for outside arrivals, locals on lock-down or stay at home)	Anyone entering Cambodia might be required to quarantine for 14 days in a designated quarantine area.
<b>Cases</b> (increasing, decreasing, flat)	Decreasing 124 cases confirmed – 0 deaths
<b>Groups</b> (limits on group gatherings, distancing requirements)	Social distancing is being recommended for all people in Cambodia, including:  Limiting group activities. Avoiding public or crowded places. Staying at home when possible.
<b>Air</b> (carriers flying to/from country)	Cambodia Angkor Air, China Air and Eva Air all reinstated air routes to Phnom Penh International Airport at the beginning of May.  Other major airlines such as Qatar Airways, Cathay Pacific, Thai Airways and Emirates have begun scheduling flights to Cambodia to resume in June and July.

<b>Borders</b> (open, closed)	<p>International borders remain closed with the exception of repatriated flights flying into one of four international Airports: Vancouver, Calgary, Montreal and Toronto; US-Canada border remains closed until June 21, 2020 where it will be reviewed in collaboration with the United States. It is unknown as to when we may consider opening up the Canadian border to International flights. Currently only essential travel is allowed. Non-essential including tourism temporarily closed.</p>
<b>Quarantine Details</b> (requirements for outside arrivals, locals on lock-down or stay at home)	<p>Canada has begun to 're-open' and most provinces across the country have identified a four or five stage phased plan for opening. While no formal lock-down was mandated, all residents were encouraged to stay home. Social distancing measures remain in effect.</p>
<b>Cases</b> (increasing, decreasing, flat)	<p>Canada is flattening the curve. Current cases:</p> <p>Total Confirmed: 79,503</p> <p>Total Deaths:5,956</p> <p>Total Recovered:40,342</p> <p>Total Active:33,205</p>
<b>Groups</b> (limits on group gatherings, distancing requirements)	<p>Most provinces have passed a Health Order that prevents mass gatherings up to 50 people until mid June. Review and assessment will take place from there. As provinces begin to re-open, they are allowing smaller, social gatherings within one or two house-holds. They are allowing households to expand their personal social network.</p>
<b>Air</b> (carriers flying to/from country)	<p>International borders remain closed with the exception of repatriated flights flying into one of four international Airports: Vancouver, Calgary, Montreal and Toronto; US-Canada border remains closed until June 21, 2020 where it will be reviewed in collaboration with the United States. It is unknown as to when we may consider opening up the Canadian border to International flights.</p>
<b>Hotels</b> (open, closed, partially open)	<p>Limited hotels are open across the country. As the provinces begin to open and we see travel restrictions lifted – local, regional, national and international – we'll see more hotels open. It will be at the discretion of the individual property/brand.</p>


