<b>Updated Date</b>	July 7th, 2020
<b>Borders</b> (open, closed)	Closed
<b>Quarantine Details</b> (requirements for outside arrivals, locals on lock-down or stay at home)	Lockdown in Buenos Aires metropolitan area and main cities. Reduced lock down in a few cities with low density populations. Except Buenos Aires metropolitan area, all the cities with less than 500.00 citizens within Argentina is in Phase 4 of quarantine, than means with 75% of activities partially activated, except schools or universities.
<b>Cases</b> (increasing, decreasing, flat)	In recent days the curve has grown very slowly and slightly, although the government still considers it controlled and within the expected normality. Total cases: 8,068 Total deaths: 374 Total recovered: 2,625
<b>Groups</b> (limits on group gatherings, distancing requirements)	Not currently possible to have group activities or social opportunities. Still keeping the social distancing.
<b>Air</b> (carriers flying to/from country)	Borders closed. The only air traffic is for sanitary flights. The situation is being evaluated every week, to decide the date of possible re open for flights.
<b>Hotels</b> (open, closed, partially open)	Closed. Depending on the property, they are estimating to reopen in July or August, however is subject to the situation.
<b>Restaurants</b> (open, closed, capacity limits)	Closed. Most of them are working with food delivery to keep the business in activity. Gastronomy industry is putting hard efforts and is well organized together to maintain on going the business and jobs.
<b>Venues</b> (open, closed, capacity limits)	Closed.


<b>Tourist Sites</b> (open, closed, capacity limits)	Closed. All public parks, areas, museums and interest places are completely closed to access.
<b>Retail Stores</b> (open, closed, capacity limits)	Only supermarkets are opened with limit of capacity to access. Shipments are working perfectly inside the country, with some delays. The government has allowed small food stores to be opened with special permissions and certifications.
<b>Transportation</b> (public and private options)	<p><b>Public transport</b> is working, with a significantly reduced capacity. Distancing between seats, and facial masks is mandatory to enter. Special daily cleaning including sanitary measures, provided by the government to the vehicles and streets.</p> <p><b>Private transportation for groups:</b> Our transportation supplier has informed the new protocol for all the services from now on.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>-hand sanitizer gel in every vehicle.</li> <li>-special cleaning with alcohol spray 70% after every service</li> <li>-the cleaning was improved with approved specific products to eliminated germs, included covid 19. The name of the chemic product is Quaternary ammonium.</li> <li>-the driver is completely isolated from the passengers, in a separate cabin, without contact.</li> <li>-Based on the government requirements, all the transportation in the country cannot be more than 60% loaded. Every passenger must wear a facial mask. The updated capacity for buses is:</li> </ul> <p>Buses of 45 seats can be loaded up to 27 seats.1  Minibuses of 24 seats can be loaded up to 14 seats  Van of 19 seats can be loaded up to 11 seats.</p>
<b>Upcoming Key Dates</b>	End of June, new measures announcement based on the flow and numbers of cases.
<b>Destination Safety and Sanitary Initiatives</b> (in progress, certification program, etc.)	Argentina was the first country in South America to take exterme measures, close the borders and announce lockdown for the whole country as soon as we got less than 10 confirmed cases. That allowed us to have a better control of the situation and prepare the hospitals and all the activities related with health to work in advance and be ready in case of a big increase of cases in a massive way, which, luckily has not happened. The advantage of an earlier lockdown, gave the government the opportunity to build temporary hospitals and also, take the measures of requesting mandatory lockdown and isolation to all the citizens that returned from abroad countries, prevented to increase the cases. 2 Nowadays is absolutely mandatory the use of facial masks everywhere. Since 2 days ago, parents are allowed to get out of home 1 hour per day with their kids, up to 500 meters. Rest of the population must keep staying at home.

<p><b>Updated Date</b></p>	<p>July 29th 2020 - based on New South Wales/NSW – Sydney only  <a href="https://covid19.homeaffairs.gov.au/">https://covid19.homeaffairs.gov.au/</a></p> <p>Sydney and NSW fully opened, with restrictions easing for residents.</p>
<p><b>Borders</b> (open, closed)</p>	<p>Australian borders are officially closed to non-essential travel. Australia and New Zealand is looking to open a Trans-Tasman flights i.e. Australia to New Zealand and vice versa very soon although no official date has been provided by the Governments. International arrivals will be extended to a “Pacific Bubble” which includes Tahiti, Fiji, Tonga, Cooks Island and possibly Hawaii. Then Australia will open its borders to designated “safe” destinations as decreed by the Australian Government’s Health expert panel.</p>
<p><b>Quarantine Details</b> (requirements for outside arrivals, locals on lock-down or stay at home)</p>	<p>A large number of businesses are returning to the office as long as social-distancing rules are in place. Employees are still being encouraged to WFH (or do both i.e. office some days and others WFH) where it is reasonably practical to do so.</p>
<p><b>Cases</b> (increasing, decreasing, flat)</p>	<p>Bravo Australia! – we are doing all possible and continuing to do all possible to combat COVID-19.</p>
<p><b>Groups</b> (limits on group gatherings, distancing requirements)</p>	<p>From June 1<sup>st</sup> all museums, galleries and libraries opened allowing 4-square-metres per person and ensuring hand washing facilities and/or sanitizer. Venues can have more than 500 people inside as long as they are separated. Travel throughout the State of New South Wales is allowed and encouraged. Beauty and Nail salons are open with strict measures in place and no more than 10 clients in a shop at any one time. Gyms are now open and operating with social distancing in classes and around the venue.</p>
<p><b>Air</b> (carriers flying to/from country)</p>	<p>Intrastate travel in New South Wales is being encouraged for all residents. Interstate is opening up this week to a majority of our 6 states and 2 territories. <p><b>Quarantine Details</b> (requirements for outside arrivals, locals on lock-down or stay at home)</p>	<p>Anyone arriving in <u>Latvia</u> and <u>Estonia</u> from a country with a higher infection rate than 15 must self-isolate for two weeks on arrival.  Anyone arriving in <u>Lithuania</u> from a country with a higher infection rate than 25 must self-isolate for two weeks on arrival.</p>

<b>Borders</b> (open, closed)	Closed
<b>Quarantine Details</b> (requirements for outside arrivals, locals on lock-down or stay at home)	Quarantine period is 21 days. As of now, no outside arrivals allowed and until Aug, 20 month there is no possibility of any outside arrival. No lockdown within the country and no local transmission of Covid.
<b>Cases</b> (increasing, decreasing, flat)	As of July,30, 2020 Total – 101 Recovered – 88 Deaths – 0
<b>Groups</b> (limits on group gatherings, distancing requirements)	Not more than 15 persons permitted at any place.
<b>Air</b> (carriers flying to/from country)	Only relief / rescue flights are operating for stranded Bhutanese nationals those who are stuck outside the country. Also, time to time cargo flights have been operating.

<b>Hotels</b> (open, closed, partially open)	Hotels are mostly closed since there is no tourist movement however, they are working with skeleton staff to handle future reservations.
<b>Restaurants</b> (open, closed, capacity limits)	Restaurants are mostly closed those are dependent on tourists but in main towns like Thimphu, Paro, many of the restaurants are open.
<b>Venues</b> (open, closed, capacity limits)	Except junior schools, nothing closed at the moment.

<b>Updated Date</b>	Wednesday, July 29, 2020
<b>Borders</b> (open, closed)	Closed until July 31 2020. Opening to decided in the next few days ahead.
<b>Quarantine Details</b> (requirements for outside arrivals, locals on lock-down or stay at home)	Brazil is divided in 26 States and the Federal District of Brasília, the Capital City of Brazil. Each State is responsible for the sanitary policies within its borders. Mayors of cities are also responsible for the definition of quarantine measure. In general, most large cities are under quarantine. As of June 16 <sup>th</sup> , several cities partially reopened businesses other than pharmacies, drugstores, supermarkets, and restaurants for delivery only. Besides hospitals and emergency rooms. Some States are starting a 6-phase plan to reopen gradually. Rio is one of them, and it is in phase 4 as of July 17th. Hotels, shopping malls, stores and restaurants may now open with restrictions for social distancing and hours of operation.
<b>Cases</b> (increasing, decreasing, flat)	As of today, the number of cases in Brazil, which is a country of 211,000,000 plus inhabitants, is slightly above 2,500,000 cases with 89,000 deaths.
<b>Groups</b> (limits on group gatherings, distancing requirements)	No grouping allowed at this time. Beaches are open for sports in Rio de Janeiro, and individual water sports are allowed in the ocean. Public parks are open.
<b>Air</b> (carriers flying to/from country)	There are flights in and out of the country, but with restrictions on purpose of travel. Many international carriers have resumed or are planning to resume flights to/from São Paulo and Rio de Janeiro now in July and in August.




<b>Hotels</b> (open, closed, partially open)	Several hotels reopened on July 17 <sup>th</sup> , but many are still closed despite the authorization to reopen one month ago. Most hotels announcing reopening in August or September.
<b>Restaurants</b> (open, closed, capacity limits)	Open with restrictions as of July 2 <sup>nd</sup> . Sidewalk cafes are open now, as well as bakeries
<b>Venues</b> (open, closed, capacity limits)	closed
<b>Tourist Sites</b> (open, closed, capacity limits)	Announcing reopening by mid-August
<b>Retail Stores</b> (open, closed, capacity limits)	Open with limited attendance capacity

<b>Borders</b> (open, closed)	<p>International borders remain closed until August 31<sup>st</sup> with the exception of repatriated flights flying into one of four international Airports: Vancouver, Calgary, Montreal and Toronto; US-Canada border remains closed until August 21, 2020 where it will be reviewed in collaboration with the United States. It is unknown as to when we may consider opening up the Canadian border to International flights. Currently only essential travel is allowed. Non-essential including tourism temporarily closed.</p>
<b>Quarantine Details</b> (requirements for outside arrivals, locals on lock-down or stay at home)	<p>There is a mandatory 14-day quarantine upon arriving into Canada until August 31<sup>st</sup>.</p> <p>Some regions have implemented mandatory mask in public indoor settings including Montreal.</p> <p>Canada has begun to 're-open' and most provinces across the country have identified a four or five stage phased plan for opening. 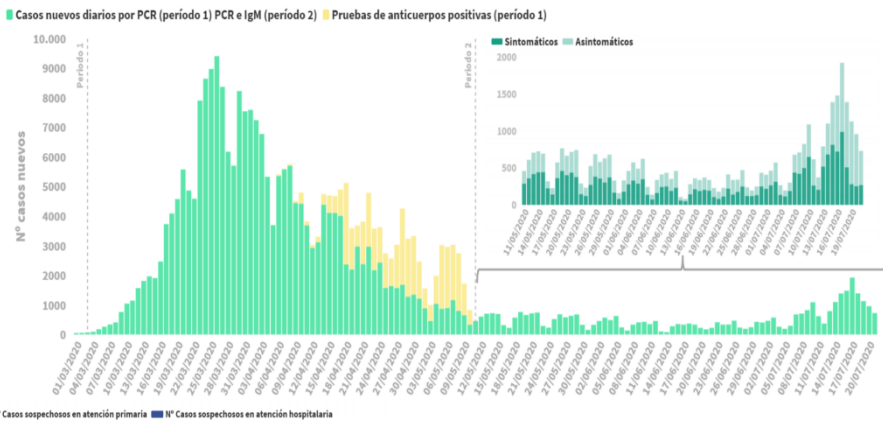

The mandatory use of face masks by persons over 6 years of age on public roads, outdoors and in enclosed spaces for public use, provided that it is not possible to maintain a social distance of at least 1.5 meters. Exceptions are made for persons with disabilities or respiratory illnesses, as well as when practicing sports or eating. Their use is also mandatory on public transport, by air, sea and rail, and in private vehicles if the occupants do not live together at the same address. Failure to comply with this measure will result in a penalty of up to 100 euros.

All the autonomous communities, with the exception of the Canary Islands and the Region of Madrid, have approved the compulsory wearing of face masks in all public spaces, even in situations when social distancing can be observed.

Large group gatherings are not yet allowed. They are on hold until authorities determine that they will be safe to go ahead depending on the epidemiological evolution of the virus spread.

In the Barcelona area, gatherings of over 10 people are currently banned.

As of June 21<sup>st</sup> with the end of the "state of alarm", entry into Spain is allowed from all European countries and countries belonging to the Schengen area, without the need to justify the reasons for the trip and without the obligation of quarantine.


Citizens of Canada are allowed to enter Spain while non-essential travel from the US is not yet allowed.

The Government has set up a series of checks for travelers entering Spain:


- All passengers arriving by air or sea must undergo a temperature check, which must be below 37.5 degrees Celsius. Shipping companies can take passengers' temperature before arriving at a Spanish port.

## Other Key Information

### Mandatory quarantine for persons arriving in Switzerland

From 6 July 2020, people arriving in Switzerland from certain countries and areas are required to go into quarantine. The Swiss Federal Council decided on 1 July 2020 to introduce this measure.

Status: 7.7.2020

Persons arriving in Switzerland from a country or area with an increased risk of infection are required to go into quarantine (this is not simply a recommendation). The Epidemics Act (in German) provides the legal basis for taking this measure.

The list of countries and regions with a high risk of infection can be found in the COVID-19 Ordinance on International Passenger Transport Measures.

### Quarantine

Since mid-June, the number of new cases of coronavirus has been rising in Switzerland as infected persons have entered the country. Anyone entering Switzerland from a country or area with a high risk of infection now has to go into quarantine for ten days (as of 6 July). You will find the list of these countries and further information on the page on Mandatory quarantine for persons arriving in Switzerland.

### Airports in Switzerland

Air passengers from abroad may enter the country through the airports at Zurich, Geneva and Basel as well as through regional airports from 15 June. You will be provided with instructions on how to best protect yourself against becoming infected with the coronavirus. **According to the rules applicable in France, you are required to wear a face mask at Basel airport.**



### Conditions of entry

### Measures introduced in Switzerland

Masks are compulsory on all public transport from 6 July.


You must observe the applicable rules on hygiene and social distancing in Switzerland. At public establishments such as restaurants, shops and museums, you must follow the rules set out in the applicable set of precautionary measures. This information will be provided on the premises.
