That allowed us to have a better control of the situation and prepare the hospitals and all the activities related with health to work in advance and be ready in case of a big increase of cases in a massive way, which, luckily has not happened. The advantage of an earlier lockdown, gave the government the opportunity to build temporary hospitals and also, take the measures of requesting mandatory lockdown and isolation to all the citizens that returned from abroad countries, prevented to increase the cases. 2 Nowadays is absolutely mandatory the use of facial masks everywhere. Since 2 days ago, parents are allowed to get out of home 1 hour per day with their kids, up to 500 meters. Rest of the population must keep staying at home.


