That allowed us to have a better control of the situation and prepare the hospitals and all the activities related with health to work in advance and be ready in case of a big increase of cases in a massive way, which, luckily has not happened. The advantage of an earlier lockdown, gave the government the opportunity to build temporary hospitals and also, take the measures of requesting mandatory lockdown and isolation to all the citizens that returned from abroad countries, prevented to increase the cases.</p> <p>Nowadays is absolutely mandatory the use of facial masks everywhere. People is allow to visit parks , with restrictions, and restaurants are opening with outdoor seating space.</p>

Quarantine Details (requirements for outside arrivals, locals on lock-down or stay at home)	Brazil is divided in 26 States and the Federal District of Brasília, the Capital City of Brazil. Each State is responsible for the sanitary policies within its borders. Mayors of cities are also responsible for the definition of quarantine measure. In general, most large cities have now partially opened businesses with safety restrictions. Most States implemented a 6-phase plan to reopen gradually. Rio is one of them, and it is in phase 6 as of August 27th . Hotels, shopping malls, stores and restaurants may now open with restrictions for social distancing and hours of operation.
Cases (increasing, decreasing, flat)	As of today, the number of cases in Brazil, which is a country of 211,000,000 plus inhabitants, is slightly above 5,000,000 cases with 148,000 deaths. The rhythm of increase has, for the 1 st time since April, started to decrease.
Groups (limits on group gatherings, distancing requirements)	Beaches are open for sports in Rio de Janeiro, and individual water sports are allowed in the ocean. Public parks are open. Small groups are allowed in public open spaces
Air (carriers flying to/from country)	Air borders are open as of August 1, 2020. Foreign visitors are welcome as long as they have valid health insurance for Covid-19 through their stay in Brazil.
Hotels (open, closed, partially open)	Several hotels reopened on July 17 th . Most hotels reopened in September and the remainder in October.
Restaurants (open, closed, capacity limits)	Open. Sidewalk cafes are open now, as well as bakeries
Venues (open, closed, capacity limits)	Some have reopened as of September 1 st .
Tourist Sites (open, closed, capacity limits)	Open since August 15 th .

Borders (open, closed)	<p>International borders remain closed with the exception of repatriated flights flying into one of four international Airports: Vancouver, Calgary, Montreal and Toronto; US-Canada border remains closed until October 31, 2020 where it will be reviewed in collaboration with the United States. It is unknown as to when we may consider opening up the Canadian border to International flights. Currently only essential travel is allowed. Non-essential including tourism temporarily closed.</p>
Quarantine Details (requirements for outside arrivals, locals on lock-down or stay at home)	<p>There is a mandatory 14-day quarantine upon arriving into Canada for any approved travel.</p> <p>Some regions have implemented mandatory mask in public indoor settings including Montreal.</p> <p>Canada has begun to 're-open' and most provinces across the country have identified a four or five stage phased plan for opening. While no formal lock-down was mandated, all residents were encouraged to stay home. Social distancing measures remain in effect. Currently most provinces are transitioning into phase 2 or 3 which primarily includes the opening of service based businesses. We are seeing some of our attractions open with strict social distancing measures in place. Unfortunately with the looser restrictions, we now seem to have entered into a second wave. Tighter controls have been reintroduced.</p>
Cases (increasing, decreasing, flat)	<p>Canada is flattening the curve. Current cases:</p> <p>Total Confirmed: 171,323</p> <p>Total Deaths: 9,530</p> <p>Total Recovered: 143,994</p> <p>Total Active: 17,799 (148 cases in critical condition)</p>
Groups (limits on group gatherings, distancing requirements)	<p>Most provinces have passed a Health Order that prevents mass gatherings up to 50 people until the last phase of their respective reopening strategy. While mass gatherings continue to be banned, some provinces are beginning to relax the measures and allowing for smaller groups both indoors and outdoors. However, we are seeing increasing case counts and there is some discussion among provinces to tighten things back up as they prepare or try to mitigate a second wave. Alberta just announced on July 20th that the province will allow exhibitions and tradeshow. The meetings and events sectors' messages are beginning to be heard, but this continues to be a pressing issue from the meetings and events industry, but governmental officials continue to believe meetings are high risk environments for community transmission of Covid-19. However, review and assessment will take place from there as provinces continue to see low transmission rates. As provinces begin to re-open, they are</p>


	allowing smaller, social gatherings within one or two house-holds. They are allowing households to expand their personal social network.
Air (carriers flying to/from country)	International borders remain closed with the exception of repatriated flights flying into one of four international Airports: Vancouver, Calgary, Montreal and Toronto; US-Canada border remains closed until October 31, 2020 where it will be reviewed in collaboration with the United States. It is unknown as to when we may consider opening up the Canadian border to International flights.
Hotels (open, closed, partially open)	More and more hotels are opening across the country, as many more provinces are now allowing interprovincial travel.
Restaurants (open, closed, capacity limits)	Beginning to reopen and many jurisdictions allow for greater than 50% capacity so long as you can maintain physical distancing of up to 2m. Depending on region in Canada, some restrictions have relaxed a little more and restaurants have been able to increase capacity so long as they continue to maintain appropriate social distancing measures. Many communities are relaxing city bylaws and are allowing restaurants to expand or establish outdoor patios. In British Columbia, due to recent cases, alcohol is no longer available to be purchased in restaurants and bars after 10:00pm.
Venues (open, closed, capacity limits)	Remain closed until phase three or four depending on the province. All venues are subject to the Health Orders in place regarding mass gatherings.
Tourist Sites (open, closed, capacity limits)	More and more attractions and sites are opening depending on the region and their own specific operating requirements. As part of the phased approach, we will see tourist sites begin to open. Currently, outdoor parks and green spaces are open. 
