The advantage of an earlier lockdown, gave the government the opportunity to build temporary hospitals and also, take the measures of requesting mandatory lockdown and isolation to all the citizens that returned from abroad countries, prevented to increase the cases. |

In general, most large cities have now partially opened businesses with safety restrictions. Most States implemented a 6-phase plan to reopen gradually. Rio is one of them, and it is in phase 6 as of August 27th . Hotels, shopping malls, stores and restaurants may now open with restrictions for social distancing and hours of operation. |
