<b>Updated Date</b>	APRIL 8th, 2021
<b>Borders</b> (open, closed)	Are Open for most of the countries, except flights from Brazil, UK, Mexico and Chile.
<b>Quarantine Details</b> (requirements for outside arrivals, locals on lock-down or stay at home)	Since April 9 <sup>th</sup> , lockdown from midnight to 6 am. Restaurants opened until 11 pm. Schools opened. Domestic flights working. Outdoor meetings up to 20 people with social distance. Absolutely mandatory the use of facial masks everywhere, sanitize the hands before entering closed places and keep the social distancing.

<b>Groups</b> (limits on group gatherings, distancing requirements)	Cultural activities, Gyms, Sports & Social clubs are permitted with a limited number inside, taking turns, and also in open places and maintaining social distancing up to 20 people. Meetings up to 20 people in open areas. Still keeping the social distancing.
<b>Air</b> (carriers flying to/from country)	Partially opened.
<b>Hotels</b> (open, closed, partially open)	Partially Opened.
<b>Restaurants</b> (open, closed, capacity limits)	Open with tables for sitting outdoor and 25% maximum capacity inside.

<b>Other Key Information</b>	Argentina has the Safe Travel Stamp provided by the World Travel Tourism Council. And also Faus DMC got this stamp Since February the population started to receive the vaccine – for sanitary staff, school teachers and adults of more than 70 years old.

<b>Borders</b> (open, closed)	<p>Australian borders are officially closed to non-essential travel. Australia will review opening it's borders later this year to designated "safe" destinations as decreed by the Australian Government's Health expert panel.</p>
<b>Quarantine Details</b> (requirements for outside arrivals, locals on lock-down or stay at home)	A large number of businesses are returning to the office as long as social-distancing rules are in place and also employees are being encouraged to WFH (or do both I.e. office some days and others WFH) where it is reasonably practical to do so.
<b>Cases</b> (increasing, decreasing, flat)	To date August 20 <sup>th</sup> there are 52 deaths and confirmed 3,966 with 2,992 recovered cases in New South Wales.
<b>Groups</b> (limits on group gatherings, distancing requirements)	<p>All museums, galleries and libraries opened allowing 4-square-metres per person and ensuring hand washing facilities and/or sanitizer. Venues can have more than 500 people inside as long as they are separated by social distancing. Travel throughout the State of New South Wales is allowed and encouraged.</p> <p>Beauty and Nail salons are open with strict measures in place and no more than 10 clients in a shop at any one time. Gyms are now open and operating with social distancing in classes and around the venue.</p>
<b>Air</b> (carriers flying to/from country)	Intrastate travel in New South Wales is being encouraged for all residents. There are restrictions in place for some States in Australia whose borders are closed. Our national carrier Qantas/QF is revisiting their flight routes and staffing levels. Currently international air travel arrivals is available for essential service personnel and residents and citizens returning to Australia from overseas. No overseas travel is permitted unless a special permit is


	obtained in the cases of hardship. Persons going in to quarantine hotels for 14 days is to their own expense.
<b>Hotels</b> (open, closed, partially open)	Sydney and NSW Hotels are opening up as from June 1 – re-employment of furloughed personnel and re-training in place.
<b>Restaurants</b> (open, closed, capacity limits)	Currently open with up to 100 people in a public restaurant seated in a maximum party of 10, and social distancing applies, with sign-in for all patrons rule applies.
<b>Venues</b> (open, closed, capacity limits)	Ditto - with stadiums open for up to 500 persons.

<b>Quarantine Details</b> (requirements for outside arrivals, locals on lock-down or stay at home)	<b>The quarantine period is 21 days.</b> Currently, Bhutan is not open for international tourism and after 6 weeks of lockdown which began on Dec, 20 3 <sup>rd</sup> weeks, all towns and places are now open for local's movement. As of date, bubble flight operating from Delhi & Kolkata once a week, and the quarantine period is 21 days for Bhutanese & Indian travelers.

<b>Groups</b> (limits on group gatherings, distancing requirements)	Group gathering is not permitted. All towns are now open for internal movements of locals.

<b>Borders</b> (open, closed)	Opened as of August 1, 2020
<b>Quarantine Details</b> (requirements for outside arrivals, locals on lock-down or stay at home)	Brazil is divided in 26 States and the Federal District of Brasília, the Capital City of Brazil. Each State is responsible for the sanitary policies within its borders. Mayors of cities are also responsible for the definition of quarantine measure. In general, most large cities have now partially opened businesses with safety restrictions. Most States implemented a 6-phase plan to reopen gradually. Rio is one of them, and it is in phase 6 as of August 27th . Hotels, shopping malls, stores and restaurants may now open with restrictions for social distancing and hours of operation.
<b>Cases</b> (increasing, decreasing, flat)	As of today, the number of cases in Brazil, which is a country of 211,000,000 plus inhabitants, is slightly above 13,400,000 cases with 310,000 deaths.
<b>Groups</b> (limits on group gatherings, distancing requirements)	Beaches are open in Rio de Janeiro for individual sports. Public parks are open. Small groups are allowed in public open spaces
<b>Air</b> (carriers flying to/from country)	Air borders are open as of August 1, 2020. Foreign visitors are welcome as long as they have valid health insurance for Covid-19 through their stay in Brazil, and a proof of being tested 48 hours before starting their trip to Brazil.

<b>Restaurants</b> (open, closed, capacity limits)	Open.

Most regions have implemented mandatory masks in public indoor settings.  With the second wave in full effect, we've seen tighter restrictions in place including lockdowns and curfews in Quebec.

<b>Groups</b> (limits on group gatherings, distancing requirements)	As we are seeing increasing case counts we are seeing provinces tighten things back up as we are now in a second wave. Most provinces have passed a Health Order that has reduced social gatherings down to a small group or even just family members. Some provinces are now implementing circuit breaker lockdowns where they are locking down for 2 weeks to help manage this second wave. Gatherings are also banned and only meetings deemed 'essential' are allowed to take place when/where necessary and must observe all social distancing and safety protocols.

**TRAVEL GENERAL INFORMATION**

Air and sea travel between Malta and specific corridor countries has resumed as of the 1st July 2020, according to the conditions stated below. A travel ban still applies to non-corridor countries.

**In view of the new variant strain of COVID-19 currently circulating in the United Kingdom, from Tuesday 22 December 2020, Malta will no longer consider the United Kingdom as a corridor country and unauthorised travel to and from the UK will not be allowed. Maltese citizens or persons with a valid Malta resident permit currently in the UK will be given the opportunity to return to Malta, subject to presenting a negative PCR test result for COVID-19, which test is to be taken no longer than 72 hours prior to arrival in Malta and testing on arrival, 14 days of mandatory quarantine with a repeat PCR test required to be taken on day 5-7 of quarantine are required.**

**Corridor Countries**

Quarantine on arrival to Malta will not be applicable to those travelling from these countries, but suspected persons will be requested to have a swab test.

An '**amber**' list of corridor countries is published from week to week from which arriving passengers must produce a negative PCR COVID-19 swab test result, which test must have been taken no longer than 72 hours prior to arrival in Malta. This is in line with Legal Notice 333 of 2020. If a negative test is not presented, a swab test on arrival or a 14 day quarantine period may be required.
