Borders (open, closed)	Are Open for most of the countries, except flights from Brazil, UK, Mexico and Chile.
Quarantine Details (requirements for outside arrivals, locals on lock-down or stay at home)	Since April 16 th , lockdown from 8 pm to 6 am. Restaurants opened until 8 pm. Schools opened. Domestic flights working. Outdoor meetings up to 10 people with social distance. Absolutely mandatory the use of facial masks everywhere, sanitize the hands before entering closed places and keep the social distancing.

Borders (open, closed)	<p><u>Estonia</u>: Borders are open to the citizens and residents of the EU, EEA, UK and the Swiss Confederation as well as several other countries listed on the official governmental websites.</p> <p><u>Latvia</u>: Borders are open to the citizens and residents of the EU, EEA, UK and the Swiss Confederation as well as several other countries listed on the official governmental websites but only for urgent matters (<i>work, training, studies, family reunion, receiving medical services, transit, escorting minors, return to permanent place of residence, funeral</i>).</p> <p><u>Lithuania</u>: Borders are open to the citizens and residents of the EU, EEA, UK and the Swiss Confederation as well as many other countries listed on the official governmental websites.</p>
Quarantine Details (requirements for outside arrivals, locals on lock-down or stay at home)	<p>When arriving in <u>Estonia</u>, <u>Latvia</u> and <u>Lithuania</u> person will be asked to show proof of a negative PCR test performed no earlier than 72 hours before boarding or crossing the border.</p> <p>Persons who are vaccinated for COVID-19 or have recovered from COVID-19 in last 6 months and can show the proof, may enter <u>Estonia</u> and <u>Lithuania</u> without mandatory PCR test and self-isolation. When arriving in <u>Latvia</u>, PCR test is still necessary, however you can skip self-isolation.</p> <p><u>Estonia</u>: Travellers arriving from countries with an infection rate higher than 150 cases per 100,000 inhabitants in the last 14 days are subject to mandatory 10-day isolation or a double testing procedure.</p> <p><u>Latvia</u>: Travellers arriving from countries with an infection rate higher than 50 cases per 100,000 inhabitants in the last 14 days are subject to mandatory 10-day isolation.</p> <p><u>Lithuania</u>: Travellers from EU Member States or Schengen Associated Countries listed as affected countries have to self-isolate for 10 days from the day of arrival in the Republic of Lithuania.</p>
Cases (increasing, decreasing, flat)	<p><u>Estonia</u>: since the start of April COVID cases has been rapidly decreasing with 14-day cumulative rate being 250 per 100,000 inhabitants (as per 01.06.21).</p> <p><u>Latvia</u>: COVID cases has been slowly decreasing since the start of March with cumulative rate being 366 per 100,000 inhabitants (as per 01.06.21).</p> <p><u>Lithuania</u>: since May COVID cases has been steadily decreasing with cumulative rate being 467 per 100,000 inhabitants (as per 01.06.21).</p>

Groups (limits on group gatherings, distancing requirements)	2+2 rule in all public places, mandatory use of face masks indoors and public places.
Air (carriers flying to/from country)	AirBaltic, Lufthansa, Finnair, Wizz Air, Ryanair, Norwegian, LOT, SmartLynx and many more are operating with extended summer schedule.
Hotels (open, closed, partially open)	Most hotels have reopened for summer
Restaurants (open, closed, capacity limits)	In <u>Latvia</u> and <u>Lithuania</u> restaurant outdoor terraces are open, + take away. <u>Estonia</u> indoor eating is possible with 50% capacity and no more than 6 persons on one table.
Venues (open, closed, capacity limits)	<u>Estonia</u> : it is allowed to be at indoor events that have seating (like at a theatre, in a cinema, at a conference) if the occupancy of the room does not exceed 50%. The number of participants is limited to 200 persons. <u>Latvia</u> : Libraries are open and are allowed to resume lending books. Cultural venues such as museums, theatres, cinemas, and exhibition venues are closed for now, but will reopen for vaccinated persons on June 15. <u>Lithuania</u> : Hotels, cinemas, galleries, SPA's, shopping centers are open.
Tourist Sites (open, closed, capacity limits)	<u>Estonia</u> : visitors are allowed at the outdoor areas of museums and exhibition facilities (including zoos), as well it is allowed to be indoors at museums and exhibitions taking into account that the occupancy of the area may not exceed 50%. The doors must close at 22.00. <u>Latvia</u> : Open-air museum areas are open. From June 1 vaccinated persons can go to SPA's <u>Lithuania</u> : Museums, zoo's, botanical gardens are open with reduced capacity
Retail Stores (open, closed, capacity limits)	Retail stores, supermarkets are closed. Grocery shops, pharmacies, optical stores, pet stores, and other businesses that provide essential services (e.g. telecommunication companies, petrol stations etc.) are allowed to operate with reduced capacity.

Borders (open, closed)	Closed - Bhutan is expected to open for tourism from Oct'2021.
Quarantine Details	The quarantine period is 21 days.

(requirements for outside arrivals, locals on lock-down or stay at home)	Currently, Bhutan is not open for international tourism and except towns bordering India where there is lockdown (Phuentsholing, Samdrup Jongkahr and Gelephu towns), no restrictions imposed in other part of the country but people still need to follow Covid-19 protocol and guidelines. As of date, bubble flight operating from Delhi & Kolkata once a week, and the quarantine period is 21 days for Bhutanese & Indian travelers.
Cases (increasing, decreasing, flat)	Confirmed cases: 1769 Recovered: 1440 Death: 1 Active: 328
Groups (limits on group gatherings, distancing requirements)	Group gathering is not permitted. All towns are now open for internal movements of locals. But people travelling to / from border towns need to obtain travelling permit.
Air (carriers flying to/from country)	As of now, bubble flights operating from Delhi & Kolkatta, every Mon from Delhi, and every Fri from Kolkatta. These flights are operated by Druk Air.
Hotels (open, closed, partially open)	All hotels are mostly closed however in some of the hotels, reservation staff working with limited capacity.
Restaurants (open, closed, capacity limits)	Restaurants are now open for locals.

Borders (open, closed)	Opened as of August 1, 2020
Quarantine Details (requirements for outside arrivals, locals on lock-down or stay at home)	Brazil is divided in 26 States and the Federal District of Brasília, the Capital City of Brazil. Each State is responsible for the sanitary policies within its borders. Mayors of cities are also responsible for the definition of quarantine measure. In general, most large cities have now partially opened businesses with safety restrictions. Most States implemented a 6-phase plan to reopen gradually. Rio is one of them, and it is in phase 6 as of August 27th . Hotels, shopping malls, stores and restaurants may now open with restrictions for social distancing and hours of operation.
Cases (increasing, decreasing, flat)	As of today, the number of cases in Brazil, which is a country of 211,000,000 plus inhabitants, is slightly above 17,500,000 cases with 490,000 deaths.
Groups (limits on group gatherings, distancing requirements)	Beaches are open in Rio de Janeiro for individual sports. Public parks are open. Small groups are allowed in public open spaces
Air (carriers flying to/from country)	Air borders are open as of August 1, 2020. Foreign visitors are welcome as long as they have valid health insurance for Covid-19 through their stay in Brazil, and a proof of being tested 48 hours before starting their trip to Brazil.
Hotels (open, closed, partially open)	Open with the necessary COVID protocols.
Restaurants (open, closed, capacity limits)	Open.
Venues (open, closed, capacity limits)	Some have reopened as of September 1 st .
Tourist Sites (open, closed, capacity limits)	Open since August 15 th .
Retail Stores (open, closed, capacity limits)	Open with limited attendance capacity
Transportation (public and private options)	Public transportation is open in Rio, as well as in other cities of Brazil.
Upcoming Key Dates	Vaccination started on January 18, 2021. Until yesterday, over 79,000,000 Brazilians were vaccinated.
Destination Safety and Sanitary Initiatives (in progress, certification program, etc.)	Use of masks in public is mandatory in most cities. Several cities have built field hospitals in stadiums, convention centers and other large open areas. Government is buying and distributing IPEs (individual protection equipment) to health professionals. Most hotels and transportation companies are establishing safety and sanitary protocols for when they reopen.

Borders (open, closed)	<p>Closed</p> <p>Entry Conditions:</p> <p>Foreigners are now allowed to visit Cambodia but must comply with a long list of regulations.</p> <p>All foreign visitors:</p> <p>Need to have a certificate no more than 72 hours old confirming that they are not infected with the novel coronavirus.</p> <p>Will be given an on-site PCR swab test.</p> <p>Must have proof of \$50,000 worth of travel insurance while in Cambodia.</p> <p>Must quarantine for 14 days after arrival at a place designated by the government.</p> <p>In addition, Cambodia has instituted a visitor-pays system of testing:</p> <p>All visitors must pay for a COVID-19 test and associated expenses upon arrival in Cambodia.</p> <p>Visitors must also make a \$2,000 deposit to cover potential costs of quarantine, hospitalization, and even burial, should they fall ill with coronavirus while in the country.</p> <p>Should the test come back positive for even one person on a flight:</p> <p>All passengers from the flight will be quarantined in a state facility at their own expense.</p> <p>If hospitalization is required, that will also be at the visitor's expense.</p>
Quarantine Details (requirements for outside arrivals, locals on lock-down or stay at home)	If one or more travelers from the same flight test positive for COVID-19 : People will be required to quarantine for 14 days at a facility designated by the Cambodia Government (Hotel or Government facility at their own expense)
Cases (increasing, decreasing, flat)	Increasing
Groups (limits on group gatherings, distancing requirements)	<p>For the first time since the beginning of the pandemic, Cambodia is recording significant numbers of new COVID-19 cases each day. The 7-day average is currently at 89 per day. Cambodia reported its first death from COVID-19 on March 11.</p> <p>On April 9 Cambodia reported a surge of 576 new COVID-19 infections, more than doubling the country's total infections. All of these cases are linked to four businessmen who broke quarantine on February 20 by bribing staff at the hotel.</p> <p>Restrictions on travel into and out of certain provinces and regions are in place. The health ministry has been urging people not to travel between provinces and cities and a law has been passed that carries long jail terms for serious violations of health measures. Check with local authorities if you're planning to travel within Cambodia.</p> <p>Most public places and service are open and restrictions are few. Gatherings of more than 20 people are not allowed.</p>

Borders (open, closed)	International borders remain closed with the exception of repatriated flights flying into one of four international Airports: Vancouver, Calgary, Montreal and Toronto; US-Canada border remains closed until May 21, 2021 where it will be reviewed in collaboration with the United States. It is unknown as to when we may consider opening up the Canadian border to International flights. Currently only essential travel is allowed. Non-essential including tourism temporarily closed. Anticipated that this rolling closure will remain until June/July 2021. Recently banned flights from India due to the increasing Covid cases.
Quarantine Details (requirements for outside arrivals, locals on lock-down or stay at home)	There is a mandatory 14-day quarantine upon arriving into Canada for any approved travel. Most regions have implemented mandatory masks in public indoor settings. With the third wave in full effect, we've seen tighter restrictions in place including lockdowns across the country.
Cases (increasing, decreasing, flat)	Canada is flattening the curve. Current cases: Total Confirmed: 1,216,387 Total Deaths: 124,204 Total Recovered: 1,109,223 Total Active: 75,281
Groups (limits on group gatherings, distancing requirements)	As we are seeing increasing case counts we are seeing provinces tighten things back up as we are now in a second wave. Most provinces have passed a Health Order that has reduced social gatherings down to a small group or even just family members. Some provinces are now implementing circuit breaker lockdowns where they are locking down for 2 weeks to help manage this second wave. Gatherings are also banned and only meetings deemed 'essential' are allowed to take place when/where necessary and must observe all social distancing and safety protocols.
Air (carriers flying to/from country)	International borders remain closed with the exception of repatriated flights flying into one of four international Airports: Vancouver, Calgary, Montreal and Toronto; US-Canada border remains closed until May 21, 2021 where it will be reviewed in collaboration with the United States. It is unknown as to when we may consider opening up the Canadian border to International flights.


Hotels (open, closed, partially open)	More and more hotels are opening across the country, as many more provinces are now allowing interprovincial travel.
Restaurants (open, closed, capacity limits)	Tighter restrictions are in place. Mostly all takeout or patio dining allowed.
Venues (open, closed, capacity limits)	Remain closed until phase three or four depending on the province. All venues are subject to the Health Orders in place regarding mass gatherings. No gathering beyond 5-10 depending on province.
Tourist Sites (open, closed, capacity limits)	More and more attractions and sites are opening depending on the region and their own specific operating requirements. As part of the phased approach, we will see tourist sites begin to open. Currently, outdoor parks and green spaces are open. Designated national parks (Banff National Park) remain closed with the exception of drive through traffic, but it is anticipated they will be opening within the month of June.
Retail Stores (open, closed, capacity limits)	Retail stores are permitted to re-open based on social distancing and safety protocols. It will be to the discretion of each retailer when they open and at what level.
Transportation (public and private options)	Public transportation is still open, albeit at a reduced schedule and capacity. Private transportation for the general public is available (Taxi, Uber), however many private transportation companies (limousine companies) are currently closed.

Those who do require a visa to enter the country may opt for air or marine entry for now.</p> <p>International arrivals by air are possible on private or commercial flights landing in Juan Santamaria Airport in San Jose (SJO) or Daniel Oduber Quiros Airport in Liberia (LIR).</p>
Quarantine Details (requirements for outside arrivals, locals on lock-down or stay at home)	<p>The Costa Rican Government is not requiring coronavirus tests nor has it issued quarantine orders for those entering the country by air or land. The following requirements have been established due to the pandemic:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> -Completing an online HEALTH PASS available at https://salud.go.cr -Acquiring medical insurance that covers lodging in the event of quarantine (\$2,000) as well as medical expenses due to contracting COVID-19 (\$50,000).
Cases (increasing, decreasing, flat)	<p>The curve tends to flatten.</p> <p>Total confirmed cases: 311922</p> <p>Total Deaths: 3929</p> <p>Total Recovered: 239917</p>
Groups (limits on group gatherings, distancing requirements)	Group gatherings are currently very restricted. Distance requirements are between 1,8m to 2m depending on location. The use of a mask is mandatory in public spaces, shops, and most businesses.
Air (carriers flying to/from country)	All U.S.-based airlines that served Costa Rica before the pandemic have resumed service or have plans to do so by June 2021.
Hotels (open, closed, partially open)	Hotels with more than 100 guest rooms are open at 75% capacity. However, public areas such as restaurants, pools, Spas, etc., are operating with limited capacity or reduced services.
Restaurants (open, closed, capacity limits)	Open at 50% capacity.
Venues (open, closed, capacity limits)	Open at 50% capacity to ensure physical distancing, with a limit of the total number of people allowed.
Tourist Sites (open, closed, capacity limits)	National parks are open at 50% capacity; most attractions are operating with limited capacity to ensure physical distancing.

- On April 26, the Government of Nepal announced a lockdown of Kathmandu as a public health measure to help slow the spread of COVID-19. The lockdown restrictions that went into effect at 0600 hours on April 29 have been extended for the 4th time for the period **till June 14, 2021**. While most restrictions remain unchanged since first issued on April 26, modifications to the original order include:
 - - Operational hours for grocery stores are limited to hours between 0700 hours to 0900 hours, and pharmacies and health-related shops are permitted to operate under normal hours.
 - Most businesses, except for some banks and certain government offices, remain closed.
 - Personal and public vehicles are also prohibited and only emergency vehicles will be permitted to travel.
 - Individuals entering the Kathmandu valley are subject to a mandatory quarantine upon arrival, and mask use and social distancing are mandated when out in town.
 - Foreigners traveling to Kathmandu to join a scheduled flight should show their passport, valid visa, and flight ticket at checkpoints to facilitate travel into the Valley.
- Nepal's civil aviation on Monday, 31 May announced the opening of limited passenger flights to and from key international gateways like Turkey, Qatar, and China.
- The government had imposed a ban on all international flights, except those between Kathmandu and New Delhi, from May 6 midnight as the second wave of the pandemic gripped the country.
- Similarly, the Cabinet meeting decided to open limited passenger flights in addition to the two weekly flights (one of Nepal Airlines and one of Air India) on the Kathmandu-Delhi sector under the air bubble arrangement in which Nepali and Indian citizens are allowed to travel following strict health safety protocols.
- Further due to the existing pandemic situation relating to the new variant of COVID 19 in the world Government of Nepal (Council of Ministers) has made the following decision on 2nd May 2021 regarding international flight operations to prevent and control the disease in Nepal
- Il schedule and passenger charter flights, except flight between Nepal and India under air bubble arrangement, have been suspended from 6th May'2021 midnight (23:59 Nepalese standard time) to 31st May'2021 midnight (23:59 Nepal Standard time)

1. There shall be only two flights a week (one flight each by Nepal Airline and Air India) under air Travel bubble arrangements between Nepal and India with effect from 6th May'2021 midnight to 31st s May'2021midnight subject to the following condition

1. Arriving passenger shall undergo mandatory quarantine at their own cost for 10 days in hotels enlisted by the Ministry of Culture, Tourism and Civil Aviation
2. Person Violating quarantine provision as stated in clouse2.1 shall be penalized in accordance with the infectious disease Act.2020 (1964CE)
3. The airline found board any PCR positive passenger shall be liable to bear the cost of hotel Quarantine of all passengers on board that aircraft
4. Passengers are required to furnish PCR report with photo identification and barcode while arriving at Tribhuvan International Airport Kathmandu

Some notables: Except for Indians and Chinese (shared borders), one cannot come via land borders.

A mandatory 72 hour PCR negative pre-boarding and a 10-day quarantine at a hotel upon arrival - for all nationalities. Proof of reservation and stay required.

Nepal is, however, still open to travel.

Nepal Government has eased the process of visiting Nepal.

1. Negative PCR report, not older than 72 hours before departing from origin country OR fully vaccinated against COVID-19 confirmation paper/card

Domestic Restrictions

The current advice is to avoid all unnecessary domestic travel. The Government is continuing measures to reduce the rate of infection and prevent the contagious variant of the virus from spreading, but is relaxing restrictions for children and young people and workplaces.

Social distancing guidance remains in force. Face masks are now being recommended by Norwegian health officials for everyone riding on public transportation in Oslo and nearby Indre Østfold.

Residents of mainland Norway can travel to Svalbard, and residents of Svalbard can travel to the mainland, without having to enter quarantine. Anyone arriving in Norway from a red area/country need to complete their full quarantine period in mainland Norway prior to travelling on to Svalbard. This applies to all who want to travel to Svalbard, including residents.

International Tourists

From 1 January 2021 UK nationals are no longer classified as EU/EEA nationals and will not be allowed to visit Norway unless they meet certain exceptions. You may be exempted if for example you are resident in another EEA/EU country or if you are a close family member of a Norwegian resident. Please see the UDI website for more detail on these exceptions. Borders to remain closed to all but essential visitors through 12 May.

Travellers who arrive in Norway from a red country (which currently includes the UK) must present a negative COVID-19 test certificate upon arrival in Norway. The test must have been taken within the 24 hours prior to departure and be in English, Norwegian, Swedish, Danish, French or German. The approved testing methods are PCR or Rapid antigen test. You may be denied entry at the Norwegian border, or boarding at the airport, if you do not produce a valid test certificate when required.
