Quarantine Details (requirements for outside arrivals, locals on lock-down or stay at home)	<p>As for national borders, from September 24th it will no longer be necessary for Argentine citizens and foreigners traveling for work to undergo quarantine upon arrival in the country. By November 1st , All foreigners and Argentine citizens who comply with the following requirements will be authorized to enter the country:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - A complete vaccination scheme (Date of last application must be at least 14 days prior to the arrival to the country) - A certificate of a negative PCR test done within 72 hours prior to the flight and antigen test upon arrival. - A PCR test done between 5 and 7 days after arrival to the country. <p>*Adults and Minors who do not are not fully vaccinated must perform quarantine upon arrival, as well as an antigen test upon entry and a PCR test 7 days post-arrival. *The requirements of the Antigen Test and PCR test after arrival for vaccinated people will be lifted when at least 50% of the total population in Argentina completes their vaccination schedule. Absolutely mandatory the use of facial masks everywhere, sanitize the hands before entering closed places and keep the social distancing.</p>

(For travellers from certain countries, only PCR tests are valid, please see below.) Tests need to be issued by a medical authority; self-tests are valid for 24 hours only if the result is entered into an official data processing system (except Vienna). Children under 12 do not need to show a test. • <u>Vaccine Certificate</u> The following vaccines (including mix-and-match vaccines) are recognised: BioNtech/Pfizer, AstraZeneca, Johnson & Johnson, Moderna, and Sinopharm. (Please be aware that this only applies to entering the country. Sinopharm is not valid for entering hotels, restaurants etc. within Austria.) Proof of antibodies is valid for 90 days from the test date.</p> <p>What proof is accepted?</p> <p>Proof of negative test, vaccination, or past infection can be a doctor's certificate, an official test result, a vaccination certificate/vaccination card/vaccine passport (including a pdf from an electronic vaccine passport, either on your phone or as a hard copy), or an official/medical certificate proving a past infection, either in German or English. If your original certificate is not in English or German, please use this official health certificate in German or English as proof.</p> <p>If you are unable to show any of these documents, you are required to take a PCR or antigen test within 24 hours of arriving in Austria (please note that you WILL need to show proof when checking into a hotel). PCR tests must be taken within 72 hours of arrival and antigen tests within 48 hours. Travellers without a negative test certificate can take a test on arrival and quarantine while awaiting the results. • Unvaccinated travellers on the red list must quarantine for 10 days on arrival. Tests must be taken on arrival and on day six. If both tests are negative, quarantine can be shortened. Vaccinated travellers are not required to test. • Travellers from omicron-risk countries must isolate for 10 days on arrival. Their status will also be affected by their vaccination status and willingness to undergo further tests. <p>Children below 12 years are exempt from quarantine and testing requirements.</p> <p><u>Latvia:</u> All travellers must complete the Covid Pass to enter Latvia. Travellers who hold the 'EU Digital COVID Certificate (EUDCC)' can enter Latvia if it includes one of the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Proof of vaccination completed 14 days after the final dose. Double dose or single dose vaccines authorised by the European Medicines Agency (EMA) and the World Health Organisation are accepted. • Negative result to a PCR or antigen test. • COVID-19 certificate of recovery. <p>Children below 12 years are exempt from testing and quarantine requirements.</p> <p><u>Lithuania:</u> All travellers entering this country must complete the Passenger Questionnaire 48 hours before arrival. Quarantine Details (requirements for outside arrivals, locals on lock-down or stay at home)	Brazil is divided in 26 States and the Federal District of Brasília, the Capital City of Brazil. Each State is responsible for the sanitary policies within its borders. Mayors of cities are also responsible for the definition of quarantine measure. In general, most large cities have now partially opened LI with safety restrictions. Most States implemented a 6-phase plan to reopen gradually. Rio is one of them, and it is in phase 6 as of August 27th . Hotels, shopping malls, stores and restaurants may now open with restrictions for social distancing and hours of operation.
Cases (increasing, decreasing, flat)	As of today, the number of cases in Brazil, which is a country of 211,000,000 plus inhabitants, is slightly above 22,600,000 cases with 621,000 deaths. Both number of cases and deaths are decreasing steadily as vaccination progresses
Groups (limits on group gatherings, distancing requirements)	Beaches are open in Rio de Janeiro for individual sports. Public parks are open. Small groups are allowed in public open spaces
Air (carriers flying to/from country)	Air borders are open as of August 1, 2020. Foreign visitors are welcome as long as they have valid health insurance for Covid-19 through their stay in Brazil, and a proof of being tested 48 hours before starting their trip to Brazil as well as of vaccination.
Hotels (open, closed, partially open)	Open with the necessary COVID protocols.
Restaurants (open, closed, capacity limits)	Open.
Venues (open, closed, capacity limits)	Some have reopened as of September 1 st .

Government is buying and distributing IPEs (individual protection equipment) to health professionals. Most hotels and transportation companies are establishing safety and sanitary protocols for when they reopen.

<p>Borders (open, closed)</p>	<p>Closed Entry Conditions: Foreigners are now allowed to visit Cambodia but must comply with a long list of regulations. All foreign visitors: Need to have a certificate no more than 72 hours old confirming that they are not infected with the novel coronavirus. Will be given an on-site PCR swab test. Must have proof of \$50,000 worth of travel insurance while in Cambodia. Must quarantine for 14 days after arrival at a place designated by the government. In addition, Cambodia has instituted a visitor-pays system of testing: All visitors must pay for a COVID-19 test and associated expenses upon arrival in Cambodia. Visitors must also make a \$2,000 deposit to cover potential costs of quarantine, hospitalization, and even burial, should they fall ill with coronavirus while in the country. Should the test come back positive for even one person on a flight: All passengers from the flight will be quarantined in a state facility at their own expense. If hospitalization is required, that will also be at the visitor's expense.</p>

To be considered fully vaccinated, a traveller must have received the full series of a vaccine (or a combination of vaccines) accepted by the Government of Canada at least 14 days prior to entering Canada.</p>


	<p>Take a COVID-19 molecular test within 72 hours of the scheduled departure time of your flight to Canada or arrival at the land border, or be prepared to show proof of a positive COVID-19 molecular test that was taken between 14 and 180 days before your arrival.</p> <p>You must use ArriveCAN to enter your information within 72 hours before you arrive in Canada, including your pre-entry test result. Have your ArriveCAN receipt and test result ready.</p> <p>If you are a foreign national travelling for discretionary purposes, you must show your ArriveCAN receipt prior to boarding the flight to Canada.</p> <p>If you are a fully vaccinated traveller, you must upload your proof of vaccination to ArriveCAN and carry your actual vaccine documentation (paper or digital copies) with you to show proof of vaccination, and retain it for 14 days after entry.</p> <p>If you are a fully vaccinated Canadian, permanent resident or someone with status under the <i>Indian Act</i> departing and entering Canada by land or air, you will not need to provide a pre-entry molecular test result if you can demonstrate that you have been away from Canada for less than 72 hours (effective November 30, 2021).</p>

A.1. Planning for Travel

i. All travelers should

a. Submit complete and factual information in self-declaration form on the online Air Suvidha portal (<https://www.newdelhairport.in/airsuvidha/apfo-registration>) before the scheduled travel, including last 14 days travel details.

b. Upload a negative COVID-19 RT-PCR report*. The test should have been conducted within 72 hrs prior to undertaking the journey.

c. Each passenger shall also submit a declaration with respect to authenticity of the report and will be liable for criminal prosecution, if found otherwise

ii. They should also give an undertaking on the portal or otherwise to Ministry of Civil Aviation, Government of India, through concerned airlines before they are allowed to undertake the journey that they would abide by the decision of the appropriate government authority to undergo home/institutional quarantine/ self-health monitoring, as warranted.

iii. Continuing with the earlier approach, travellers from certain specified Countries (based on epidemiological situation of COVID-19 in those Countries) are identified for additional follow up. These include need for additional measures as detailed in para (xviii) below. The listing of such specified Countries is a dynamic exercise based on evolving situation of COVID-19 across the world and will be made available on the websites of Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, (mohfw.gov.in) and the link of the same will be available at website of Ministry of External Affairs and Air Suvidha Portal.

iv. All travellers who need to undertake testing on arrival, should preferably pre-book the test online on Air Suvidha Portal, to facilitate timely testing.

A.2. Before Boarding

v. Passengers originating or transiting from at-risk countries shall be informed by the airlines that they will undergo post arrival testing, quarantine if tested negative, stringent isolation protocols if tested positive etc. as mentioned in para (xviii).

vi. Do's and Don'ts shall be provided along with ticket to the travellers by the airlines/agencies concerned.

vii. Airlines to allow boarding by only those passengers who have filled in all the information in the Self Declaration Form on the Air Suvidha portal and uploaded the negative RT-PCR test report

viii. At the time of boarding the flight, only asymptomatic travellers will be allowed to board after thermal screening.

ix. All passengers shall be advised to download Aarogya Setu app on their mobile devices.

A.3. During Travel

x. In-flight announcement about COVID-19 including precautionary measures to be followed shall be made at airports and in flights and during transit.

xi. During in-flight crew shall ensure that COVID appropriate behaviour is followed at all times. xii. If any passenger reports symptoms of COVID-19 during flight, he/she shall be isolated as per protocol.

xiii. Proper in-flight announcements should be made by the airlines regarding the testing requirements and people who need to undergo such testing to avoid any congestion at the arrival airports.

A.4. On arrival

xiv. De-boarding should be done ensuring physical distancing. xv. Thermal screening would be carried out in respect of all the passengers by the health officials present at the airport. The self-declaration form filled online shall be shown to the airport health staff.

xvi. The passengers found to be symptomatic during screening shall be immediately isolated and taken to medical facility as per health protocol. If tested positive, their contacts shall be identified and managed as per laid down protocol# .

xvii. Travellers from specified Countries at risk [as mentioned in para (iii) and (iv) above] will follow the protocol as detailed below:

- Submission of sample for post-arrival COVID-19 test* at the point of arrival (self-paid). Such travellers will be required to wait for their test results at the arrival airport before leaving or taking a connecting flight.
- If tested negative they will follow, home quarantine for 7 days and shall undertake RTPCR test on the 8th day of arrival in India*.
- Travelers shall also be required to upload results of repeat RT-PCR test for COVID-19 done on 8th day on Air Suvidha portal (to be monitored by the respective States/UTs).
- If negative, they will further self-monitor their health for next 7 days.
- However, if such travellers are tested positive, their samples should be further sent for genomic testing at INSACOG laboratory network.
- They shall be managed at isolation facility and treated as per laid down standard protocol including contact tracing mentioned in para (xvii).
- The contacts of such positive case should be kept under home quarantine monitored strictly by the concerned State Government as per laid down protocol.

xviii. Travellers from Countries excluding those in referred to in para (iii) and (iv) above, will follow the protocol as below:

- a. A sub-section (2% of the total flight passengers) shall undergo post-arrival testing at random at the airport on arrival.
- b. These 2% of such travellers in each flight shall be identified by the concerned airlines (preferably from different countries).
- c. Laboratories shall prioritize testing of samples from such travellers.

- d. All travellers (including those 2% who were selected for random testing on arrival and were found negative) will undergo home quarantine for 7 days and shall undertake RT-PCR test on the 8th day of arrival in India*.
- e. Travelers shall also be required to upload results of repeat RT-PCR test for COVID-19 done on 8th day on Air Suvidha portal (to be monitored by the respective States/UTs).
- f. If negative, they will further self-monitor their health for next 7 days.
- g. However, if such travellers are tested positive, their samples should be further sent for genomic testing at INSACOG laboratory network. h. They shall be managed at isolation facility and treated as per laid down standard protocol including contact tracing mentioned in para (xvii).

xix. If travellers under home quarantine or self-health monitoring, develop signs and symptoms suggestive of COVID-19 or test positive for COVID-19 on re-testing, they will immediately self-isolate and report to their nearest health facility or call National helpline number (1075)/ State Helpline Number.

International travellers arriving at seaports/land ports

International travellers arriving at seaports/land ports xx. International travellers arriving through seaports/land ports will also have to undergo the same protocol as above, except that facility for online registration is not available for such passengers currently.

xxi. Such travellers shall submit the self-declaration form to the concerned authorities of Government of India at seaports/land ports on arrival.

* Children under 5 years of age are exempted from both pre- and post-arrival testing. However, if found symptomatic for COVID-19 on arrival or during home quarantine period, they shall undergo testing and treated as per laid down protocol.

Contacts of the suspect case are the co-passengers seated in the same row, 3 rows in front and 3 rows behind along with identified Cabin Crew. Also, all the community contacts of those travellers who have tested positive (during home quarantine period) would be subjected to quarantine for 14 days and tested as per ICMR protocol.

Requirements for entry into Italy

 - providing the [EU Digital Covid Certificate](#) or [other equivalent certification](#) in one of the following languages: Italian, English, French or Spanish, showing one of the following conditions:

- or**
- that you have recovered from COVID-19 (the certificate of recovery is valid for 180 days from the date of the first positive swab)

- that you have taken a negative **molecular or antigen swab test** prior to entering Italy. **Children under 6 years of age are exempt from the pre-departure swab test.**

It should also be noted that the certificate of completion of the vaccination cycle must include one of the four vaccines approved by the European Medicines Agency:

- **Comirnaty by Pfizer-BioNtech**
- **Moderna**
- **Vaxzevria**
- **Janssen (Johnson & Johnson)**
- **or to vaccines considered equivalent by Italian law**

Entry into Italy without self-isolation

Anyone who has stayed or passed through one of the countries on **List D** in the 14 days prior to entering Italy **without self-isolation (5 days)** must comply with the following regulations:

- fill out the [Passenger Locator Form](#) prior to entering Italy. This form replaces the self-declaration made to the travel company and can be shown in both **digital and paper format**
- take a negative molecular or antigen **swab test** in the **72 hours** prior to entering Italy; in the case of arrivals from the **UK and Northern Ireland**

and British Isles, the swab test must be taken in the **48 hours** prior to entering Italy

- present the **COVID-19 Green Certificate**, or equivalent certificate, certifying the completion of the vaccination cycle to the transport operator at the time of boarding and to anyone appointed to carry out the checks. Persons who have stayed in or passed through **Canada, Japan and the United States of America** in the fourteen days prior to their entry into Italy, can also show a COVID-19 Green Certificate certifying recovery or a certificate issued by the competent health authorities certifying recovery. These certificates can be shown digitally or on paper.

Entry into Italy with self-isolation requirement (5 days)

This prevention measure shall be applied **only** to people entering Italy without showing **either** a negative swab test **or** a vaccination certificate.

Travellers who do not present the vaccination certificate must:

- fill out the [Passenger Locator Form](#) prior to entering Italy. This form replaces the self-declaration made to the travel company and can be shown in both **digital and paper format**
- take a negative molecular or antigen **swab test** in the **72 hours** prior to entering Italy; in the case of arrivals from the **UK and Northern Ireland** and British Isles, the swab test must be taken in the **48 hours** prior to entering Italy

Functions such as seminars, meetings, and training can also be conducted.

- Some restrictions on gathering without purpose at public places, taking out mass protests, and celebrating mass festivals are still not allowed.
- Religious ceremonies in temples and other holy sites are allowed, but they can only be conducted by priests, without any public gathering.
- Foreigners traveling to Kathmandu to join a scheduled flight should show their passport, valid visa, and flight ticket at checkpoints to facilitate travel into the Valley.

Nepal's civil aviation on Monday, 31 May announced the opening of limited passenger flights to and from key international gateways like Turkey, Qatar, and China.

The government had imposed a ban on all international flights, except those between Kathmandu and New Delhi, from May 6 midnight as the second wave of the pandemic gripped the country.

However, The Nepal civil aviation body on the 18th July also permitted the national flag carriers of Nepal and India to increase the number of weekly flights on the Kathmandu – Delhi route under the air bubble arrangement from the two at present to six.

Similarly, the Cabinet meeting decided to open limited passenger flights in addition to the two weekly flights (one of Nepal Airlines and one of Air India) on the Kathmandu-Delhi sector under the air bubble arrangement in which Nepali and Indian citizens are allowed to travel following strict health safety protocols.

All Airlines Operating International Flights from/to Nepal

Following the decision of the Government of Nepal (Council of Ministers) on 21 June 2021, all passengers (Nepali & Foreign nationals) traveling into Nepal from abroad are required to follow the enlisted health & quarantine protocols compulsory with immediate effect

1. must have a medical certificate with a negative RT-PCR or equivalent testing (Gene Xpert/True NAAT) report with photo identification & Barcode/QR code (as per the availability, Nepali diplomatic mission at the country of departure may prescribe otherwise) issued by the registered COVID-19 Labs of respective countries within 72 hours from the swab collection time to the departure time of the flight with the exemption of test report for their minors below the age of five years,
2. must possess the printed barcode obtained after filling up ARMS (Abroad Returnee Management System) forms available at the website of CCMC, Nepal(ccmc.gov,np)
3. except exempted as per clause (4), are subjected to furnish the evidence of hotel bookings of 07 days for quarantine at their own cost in the hotels listed by the Ministry of Culture, Tourism & Civil Aviation / Nepal Tourism Board or CCMC, Nepal

4. travelers, as categorized below on the basis of specified documents, are subjected to home/self-quarantine of 10 days upon arrival;

a) passengers with a complete COVID-19 vaccination certificate,

b) those coming for emergency purposes like for funerals and mourning with a Negative Antigen test & recommendation by concerned local levels,

c) sick people as well as their carers, senior citizens above 70 years, children below five years and their guardians, and differently-abled people, certified by hospitals and with a Negative Antigen test & recommendations from respective local levels,

d) government employees, security personnel, diplomats, a staffer of Diplomatic Mission in Nepal ANGOs and their families returning to Nepal, and individuals/volunteers involved in the rescue mission of Human Trafficking Victims and Nepalis Stranded abroad, based on their office/mission recommendations,

e) ex-pats returning to Nepal, owing to deportation/liberation, are subjected to hotel quarantine of 7 days under the entire management of the Government of Nepal in line with the recommendation of the concerned Nepali Diplomatic Mission,

5) airline crew members have been subjected to the Health Protocols developed by concerned airlines as per the guidelines of ICAO,

6) all of those, spending their quarantine in the hotels' homes, have to do RT-PCR tests on the 7 & and 11th day of their arrival.

In case, if anyone is found flouting the provisions of COVID-19 Crisis Management Ordinance -2021.

1. Conditions to be Fulfilled by Foreign Nationals Arriving Nepal

a. 1. Visa on arrival shall be granted to nationals of those countries who are entitled to a visa on arrival to Nepal as per the prevalent law and who have taken complete dose/doses of Covid 19 vaccine/s. Above mentioned nationals shall apply for a visa at the entry points of Immigration in Nepal with the following documents, besides other documents, Evidence of Completion of 14 days of the period of Covid 19 vaccination, 72 hours Covid 19 Negative Report prior to Check-in at the Airlines Counter, a copy of Expedition or Trekking Permit, if required so, evidence of hotel booking to log in to www.ccmc.gov.np, to fill International Traveler Online Arrival Form and print a copy of the same

2. For those who are Double Vaccinated and want to obtain Visa from Nepal Embassy in their respective country, Visa Application to the Nepal Embassy must include documents stated in Clause 3 (Sub Clause

a, c, d) and proof as per Clause 3 (Sub Clause b, e) apart from regular documents required for Visa.

1. For those who have not received the Double Vaccination, Visa must be obtained beforehand from the respective Nepal Embassy abroad or through Visa Recommendation through travel/ tour/ trekking agency in Nepal. In such cases, Visa Application must include documents stated in Clause 3 (Sub Clause a, c, d) and proof as per Clause 3 (Sub Clause b, e) apart from regular documents required for Visa.
2. All foreign nationals entering Nepal must undergo Antigen Test at the Nepal Immigration entry point. Those with Positive Antigen Test report shall be sent to isolation center or hospitals as recommended by the Ministry of Health and Population.
3. For those who are unable to undergo Antigen Test at the Nepal Immigration Entry Point, PCR Test or Antigen Test must be taken when in the hotel, and the visitor shall be allowed movement from the hotel only after RT PCR Negative.

All tourists entering Nepal must possess the following documents:

The Government of Nepal has issued the following order to manage the transportation of Nepalese and foreigners coming to Nepal from abroad to prevent, control, diagnosis, and treatment of Covid infection. Necessary documents in the rights of foreign citizens who want to enter Nepal after completing the amount of dig:

1. Proof that days of completing the quantity against Covid-have been completed.
2. Proof that the report of Covid hopeless test within hours is negative instead of checking in for air aviation
3. Copy of the permission related to mountain climbing and walk and other subjects that need permission
4. Proof of booking a hotel in Nepal. Print letter filling the online form by logging in to www.ccmc.gov.np (International traveler online arrival form)

Rules to be followed by foreign citizens who want to enter Nepal without fulfilling the number of digs or after entering:

1. Foreign citizens must stay in hotel quarantine at their own expense for the right to look positive while testing antigen at Nepal's immigration entrance point. On the day, only after the report comes negative by testing Covid, such foreign citizens will be able to engage in the work according to the purpose of their visit to Nepal.
2. Foreign citizens themselves have to suffer while testing covid or living in isolation and other expenses including insurance.
3. If all foreign citizens visiting Nepal see the signs or signs of Covid -, they should immediately test Covid-and stay in isolation if the report comes positive.
4. Tourists coming to Nepal through travel or trekking will have the responsibility of following the conditions as per this order.

5. The hotel will have the responsibility of following the criteria to foreign citizens living in hotel quarantine or isolation.
6. If a tourist does not follow the conditions as per this order, the concerned agency or hotel should immediately provide the information to the Nepal Police or the concerned body.

Obtaining a visa before arriving in Nepal:

- Get a recommendation letter (through the registered agent in Nepal) from Tourism Department OR Nepal Tourism Board.
- Hotel booking confirmation
- Travel Insurance
- Get a visa from the nearest embassy submitting the above three along with your passport and other required information requested by the embassy.

Obtaining Visa on arrival:

Visitors should have received their last dose of the Covid-19 vaccine at least 14 full days before entering Nepal. A negative RT-PCR or Gene Expert or True NAAT test is required for all to travel to Nepal.

All travelers need to undergo mandatory antigen or rapid antigen tests at immigration entry points.

- Negative PCR report, not older than 72 hours before departing from origin country OR fully vaccinated against COVID-19 confirmation paper/card
- Nepal Vias or recommendation letter of Tourism department or Nepal Tourism board to obtain visas on arrival.
- Hotel booking confirmation
- Travel Insurance.

Note: Visa will be granted as per the Nepalese law & immigration directory. Please note the section attached on nationals who are barred from upon arrival visa in Nepal. These nationalities will have to acquire the visa from consulates and embassy from home country.

Once you arrive:

 - b. Pay for the mandatory COVID-19 local travel insurance cover at USD 12 for a policy of USD 50,000 up to one month (including children below 2 years).
 - c. Pay for the PCR tests (USD 40 per PCR test) depending on the status of your vaccination.
 - d. Have done a negative PCR test within 72 hours before embarkation (Children below 2 years are exempted).
 - e. Airport transfers to be arranged by either the respective Safe & Secure Certified L1 hotels or Certified Safe & Secure travel agents. Visit www.srilanka.travel/helloagain for details.

At the airport produce the following:

- Negative COVID-19 PCR report (English) taken within 72 hours before embarkation (All travelers excluding children below 2 years).
- Original vaccination certificate/card (together with a certified copy of English language translation if the certificate/card is not in English or if relevant data are not indicated in English).
- Completed Health Declaration Form. A separate form should be submitted for each of the accompanying children (if any).

On-arrival

(Day 1) PCR test i. All travelers should undergo on-arrival (Day 1) COVID-19 PCR tests at "Safe & Secure Certified L1" hotels. ii. Not-vaccinated Children:

- Children below 12 years are exempted from on-arrival (Day 1) PCR testing. However, if the parents/guardians develop symptoms or receive positive results in on-arrival PCR tests, children will undergo PCR tests.

- Children of 12 -18 years need to undergo Day 1 PCR testing.
Exit PCR/Rapid Antigen Test Not-Fully-Vaccinated Travellers (Travellers who have not completed two weeks after the vaccination) Travellers who are vaccinated, yet not completed 2 weeks from the recommended doses of vaccination will be entitled to a shorter flexible bio-bubble period as below;

i. Travellers will undergo the Exit PCR / Rapid Antigen test on the completion of 14 days from the recommended doses of vaccination and upon negative PCR test results, they will leave the bio-bubble.

ii. Not-vaccinated Children: a. Children below 12 years are exempted from Exit PCR / Rapid Antigen tests and can be released with the parent b. Children of 12 - 18 years shall perform Exit PCR / Rapid Antigen tests on similar dates as their parents' and should have negative results. However, if

the exit PCR test result of an accompanying traveler of the child is positive for COVID-19, the child will also be subjected to a PCR test subsequently.

iii. After verifying the status of vaccination and the completion of 2-weeks of the recommended doses of vaccination and negative Exit PCR / Rapid Antigen tests results, the respective Safe & Secure L1 Hotel doctor / in charge will issue a "Discharge Document" and release the travelers from bio-bubble.

Exit PCR/Rapid Antigen Test Not-Vaccinated Travellers

- I. All Travellers will perform an Exit PCR / Rapid Antigen test on Day 12. If the particular traveler departs the country before Day 14 from arrival, Exit PCR / Rapid Antigen test is NOT required.
- II. Not-vaccinated Children:
- III. Children below 12 years are exempted from the Exit PCR / Rapid Antigen test. However, if the exit PCR test of an accompanying traveler of the child is positive for COVID-19, the child will also be subjected to PCR test subsequently.
- IV. Not-vaccinated children of 12-18 years should undergo an Exit PCR / Rapid Antigen test on Day 12 (after arriving in Sri Lanka). iii. After the 2-week completion and verifying the negative PCR / Rapid Antigen test results, the respective Safe & Secure L1 Hotel doctor/in charge will issue a "Discharge Document" and release the travelers from bio-bubble.

2nd PCR Test Not-vaccinated

- All Travelers will perform the 2nd PCR (Exit PCR) on Day 14.
- If the particular traveler departs the country before Day 14 from arrival, 2nd PCR is NOT required.
- Children below 2 years are exempted from exit COVID-19 PCR test. However, if the exit PCR test of an accompanying traveler of the child is positive for COVID-19, the child will also be subjected to a PCR test subsequently.
- Upon negative exit PCR test result, travelers can leave the bio-bubble on completion of Day 14 and go into the community. The respective Safe & Secure L1 Hotel doctor will issue a "Discharge Document" and release the travelers from bio-bubble.

Fully Vaccinated Travelers: (Valid for arrivals from 29th September 2021)

Applies to International Tourists visiting Sri Lanka under a tourist visa. No prior approval is required from the Ministry of Foreign Affairs or Civil Aviation Authority. There is no minimum duration of stay in Sri Lanka. Travelers who have completed 14 days after the recommended doses of COVID-19 vaccination and arriving with a negative COVID-19 PCR Report done within 72 hours of embarkation will be considered fully vaccinated

travelers. Any vaccination type accepted by the country of origin will be accepted. This protocol is applicable for travelers not arriving from or with no travel history (including transit) to any travel restricted country in the past 14 days

Prior to boarding, travelers are required to

i. Visit www.visitsrilanka.gov.lk to pay for mandatory COVID 19 Local Insurance cover at USD 12 for a policy of USD 50,000 up to a period of one month (including children below 2 years) and obtain the Tourism reference number required to apply for the visa. • If accompanied by not-vaccinated children of 12-18 years, pay for an on-arrival PCR test at USD 40 per test.

ii. Have a valid tourist visa. All visas must be applied online. Visit eta.gov.lk. Ensure you include the Tourism reference number when applying for a visa.

iii. Have done a negative PCR test within 72 hours before embarkation (Children below 2 years are exempted).

At the airport produce the following:

i. Negative COVID-19 PCR report (English) taken within 72 hours before embarkation (Applicable to all travelers excluding children below 2 years).

ii. Original vaccination certificate/card (together with a certified copy of English language translation if the certificate/card is not in English or if relevant data are not indicated in English).

iii. Completed Health Declaration Form. A separate form should be submitted for each of the accompanying children (if any).

On-arrival PCR tests

i. No on-arrival PCR test for “Fully Vaccinated” travelers.

ii. Not-vaccinated Children:

- No on-arrival PCR test for Not-vaccinated children up to 12 years and they will be allowed to travel with their parents.

- Not-vaccinated children of 12 -18 years need to undergo on-arrival PCR testing at the Ministry of Health approved laboratory at BIA or at a Safe & Secure Certified Level 1 hotel. If the Day 1 PCR report is negative, they will be allowed to travel with their parents. iii. No 2nd PCR for fully vaccinated travelers.

Accommodation & Airport transfers Fully vaccinated travelers are allowed to make their arrangements for accommodation, airport transfers, and local transportation. However, advised using safe and secure certified accommodations and travel agents to ensure their health and safety

Travelers with the past history of COVID-19

Travelers with a history of COVID-19, carrying a valid document certifying COVID-19 illness (in English) and departed between 28 - 90 days from the date of positive COVID-19 Nucleic Acid Amplification Test (NAAT)** will be considered under this category.

Such travelers should arrive after getting at least a single dose of Astra Zeneca/ Pfizer BioNTech/ Moderna/ Johnson & Johnson vaccine or any other single-dose COVID-19 vaccine recommended. This vaccine should be given 14 days after the positive NAAT** and 14 days before departure. ** This certificate should contain the name of the person, dates, and names of the positive NAAT**

Stay at a Certified Safe & Secure L1 hotel for 24-48 hours until the on-arrival PCR test (Day 1) report is available and NO further quarantine is necessary if the test report is negative. Hotel Doctor at Safe & Secure Certified Level 1 Hotel should discharge the traveler by issuing a "Discharge Document" after verifying the vaccination status and the document certifying the history of COVID-19. Children below 18 years will be allowed to leave the bio-bubble with the parents by adhering to the following measures:

- Children of 2-18 years are subjected to an on arrival (Day 1) PCR testing and they should have negative results.
- Children below 2 years will not be subjected to on arrival PCR testing and will be allowed to leave bio-bubble with the parents. However, if the on arrival (Day1) PCR testing of an accompanying traveler of the child is positive for COVID-19, a child below 2 years will also be subjected to PCR testing subsequently

No 2nd PCR for the adults who have not arrived/ no travel history (including transit) to any travel restricted country (Please visit: www.srilanka.travel/helloagain)

Domestic Restrictions

The Swedish government is not restricting domestic travel. However, there are temporary recommendations which include keeping your distance, avoiding public transport and crowded areas. Public gatherings are limited to eight people.

The Swedish Public Health Agency advises that it is important for everyone to maintain physical distance from other people, both while travelling and at the destination. Public transport is in operation, but frequency and capacity may be limited. From 7 January 2021 the Swedish Public Health agency recommends face masks on public transport.

International Tourists

The Swedish government has imposed restrictions on travel from the UK to Sweden and entry requirements on travel to Sweden for foreign nationals. A temporary entry ban applies to passengers arriving from countries outside the EU/EEA, including the UK, until 31 May. Some categories of passengers from the UK are exempt from this entry ban, including those who live in Sweden.

The Government has decided to extend the general entry ban for foreign citizens who cannot present a negative COVID-19 test result on arrival in Sweden until 31 May 2021. Foreign nationals exempted from the entry bans must provide a negative COVID-19 test before entering Sweden. You can read more about the test requirements on the Swedish Border Police's website. Some categories of travellers from the UK are exempt from the testing requirement, including those who live in Sweden.

The Swedish government recommends that all passengers arriving in Sweden should self-isolate for seven days. They should also take a PCR test on the day of arrival and after five days. They should do this even if they have shown a negative COVID-19 test on arrival.

Testing Information

Foreign nationals, including from the UK, must provide a negative COVID-19 test before entering Sweden. The Swedish Border Police accept tests from an authorised provider. This test must be taken within 48 hours of arrival in Sweden. The Swedish government recommends that all passengers arriving in Sweden should self-isolate for seven days. They should also take a PCR test on the day of arrival and after five days. They should do this even if they have shown a negative COVID-19 test on arrival.

Hotels, Bars & Restaurants

Accommodation remains open in Sweden.

Restaurants, bars and catering establishments must close at 8:30 pm. It is still possible for businesses to supply food for takeaway after 8:30 pm.

Events/Mass Gatherings

Public gatherings are also limited to 8 people. An exception is made for funerals, where up to 20 participants are allowed.
